To the parents and families of our applicants:

VOICE Missions is a service opportunity to volunteer teaching English in Taiwan for two school semesters starting at the end of August, plus summer camps in the month of July. Our volunteers live on teams of 2-8 people, and are provided with a place to stay by the schools they work with, and a stipend to pay for their daily expenses. The trip is first and foremost a service opportunity rather than a program for training or mentoring our volunteers. While our volunteers do live on teams, the expectation is that each person should be capable of being responsible to take care of themselves as well as self-motivated to set and keep their own schedules and seek out ministry opportunities within their communities.

This opportunity is for young adults who have maturity in how they relate to others, flexibility and respect for exploring a new culture, and the independence needed to live responsibly on their own. We understand that no person is perfect, so we are looking for people with a genuine heart to come and serve, and who are ready to grow in their relationship with Christ.

Because of the many responsibilities and challenges our volunteers face while working in a new culture, we hope that they can have the active support of their family and friends back home. Some suggestions for this are to help them build a network of people who are praying for them throughout the year, encouraging them to become involved with local Taiwanese churches, and helping to pass on updates on how they are doing among their local church and supportive community.
